One way to conduct research is to seek students' opinions. In a poll of twenty Village Elementary students, seven said yes and thirteen said no.



Students would give me a quick yes like they weren't hearing what I was saying. If they said no it was a stern no and no reason was given. Below, you will find responses from individual students for both kids who liked the idea of uniforms and those that didn't.

Yes:

Rachel Scott, first person killed at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999. Rachel's brother, Craig, was at the library that day with his two friends. Craig lost two friends and just escaped death himself. Rachel handed in an essay a month before she died. It was titled "My Ethics My Codes of Life." She wanted to start a chain reaction. She said, "I have this theory that if one person can go out of their way to show compassion then it will start a chain reaction of the same. People will never know how far a little kindness can go."

Rachel's parents found something written on the side of her dresser she wrote when she was 13. It read "These hands belong to Rachel Joy Scott and will someday touch millions of people's hearts." Then Rachel's father came up with Rachel's Challenge. She believed we could change the world one person at a time because little things can do so much to make a difference.

The whole point of Rachel's Challenge was to inspire people to tell all to treat others with respect, appreciate everyone no matter what, forgive and be forgiven, dream big and believe in yourself.
